After the deaths of George Floyd, Ahmaud Aubrey, and Breonna Taylor, as well as the ongoing violence towards Black men and women, protests of multiracial and intersectional people have erupted across the country. This nationwide movement has prompted serious conversations and proposed actions in schools and communities tackling systemic racist policies and practices. The public response has highlighted the racial trauma that students, families, staff, school administration and communities of color have not only endured for centuries but continue to face today. This session, comprised of education stakeholders, will speak to the impact of systemic discrimination in our education system. The session will discuss best practices to remove barriers and move towards an antiracist, equitable school climate.
