

### What is PSBA?

The Pennsylvania School Boards Association is a nonprofit statewide association of public school boards, pledged to the highest ideals of local lay leadership for the public schools of the commonwealth.

Formed on the fundamental concept of local control of public education, PSBA is a strong advocate of the proposition that the local school board – where elected citizens make decisions that affect, influence and direct the education of the community's youth – is the cornerstone of a free society.

PSBA, founded in 1895, was the first school boards association established in the United States.

Membership in the association is voluntary and open to public school districts, intermediate units, career and technical schools, community colleges and other eligible local education agencies.

PSBA's membership services, designed to assist school directors as a board and as individuals, are delivered through the staff departments of government affairs, member services, legal services, insurance services and communications.
